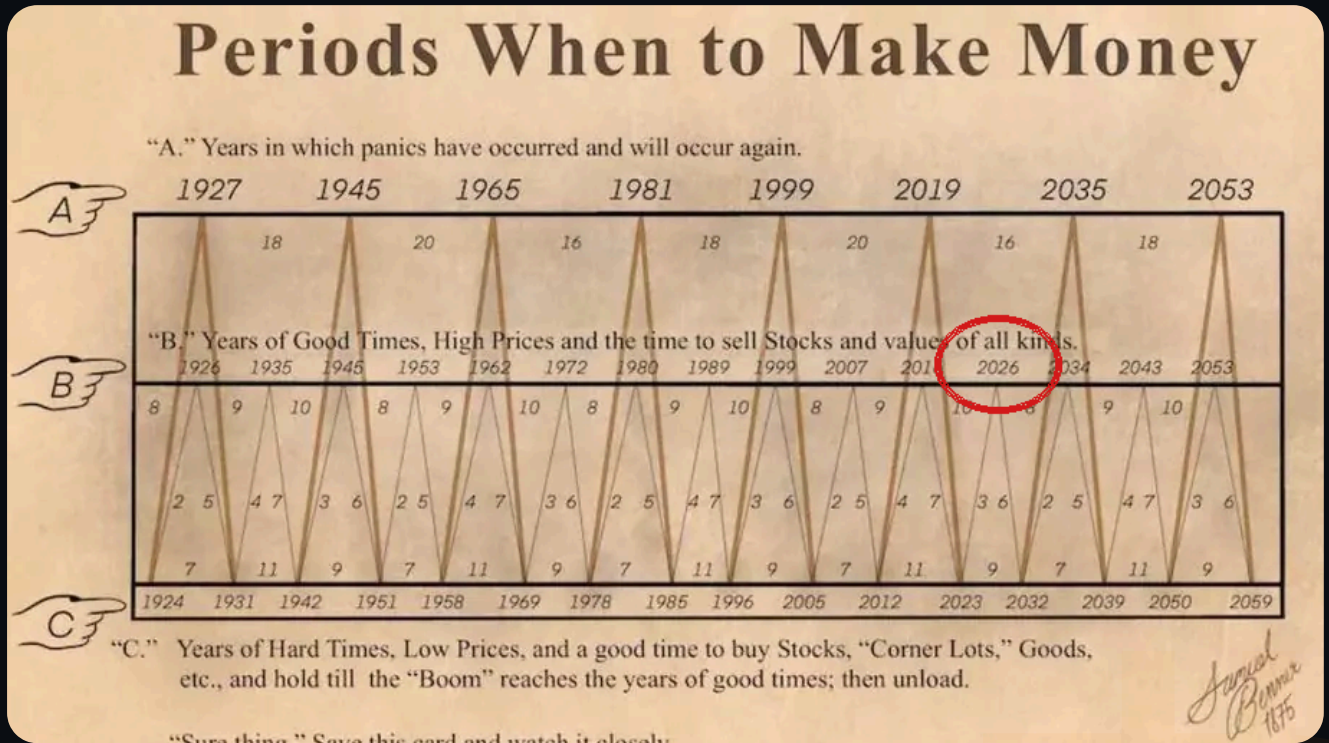


THE 5-MINUTE PREDICTION CHECK

How to test any chart, indicator, or guru call before you trust it. The exact method, in plain English. No hype, just the receipts.

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THE 5-MINUTE PREDICTION CHECK

Run this on any chart, indicator, or prediction before you touch your money.

Something promises to call the market. A chart, an indicator, a guru with a date. Before you trust it, ask these 5 questions.

- 1 Pin it down.** What exactly does it predict, and on what date? No clear date means no real prediction.
- 2 Count the misses.** List every call it made and mark each one hit or miss. Your brain only kept the wins.
- 3 Beat the coin.** Would a random guess look this good? Big market swings happen often, so landing near one is easy.
- 4 Beat doing nothing.** If you had followed it with real money, would you have beaten just buying once and holding?
- 5 Watch the wiggle words.** "Around" and "within a few years" make anything look right. And check the safe feeling is not just from sitting in cash.

The rule. Fail even one, and you do not owe that prediction your money. A real one survives all five.

A COIN FLIP CAN LOOK LIKE A PROPHET

Why a prediction can feel like magic.

Here is the trap. It is not the prediction. It is your own head.

When it nails one big call, you never forget it. When it misses, you quietly forget that too.

So a tool that is right about half the time can feel like it can see the future.

That is not the tool being smart. That is your memory keeping score in a broken way.

The fix is simple. Stop trusting the feeling. Run the same 5 checks every time.

TEST 1 AND 2. PIN IT DOWN, COUNT THE MISSES

Test 1. Pin it down.

Before you check anything, write the claim down word for word. What it predicts, and when. Give it a date and a number.

If the person sharing it will not name a clear date, you are done. That is not a prediction. That is a vibe.

Test 2. Count the misses.

Now list every call it has ever made. Put a check or an X next to each one.

You have to write the misses down yourself, because your memory already deleted them.

Think of the weather guy. You remember the one time he nailed the big storm. You forgot the ten times he was wrong.

TEST 3 AND 4. BEAT THE COIN, BEAT DOING NOTHING

Test 3. Beat the coin.

Before you are impressed that something is right half the time, ask one thing. How often would a random guess look just as good?

Big market swings happen all the time. So landing near one is easy, even with your eyes closed.

If a coin flip ties it, it has no skill. It just had company.

Test 4. Beat doing nothing.

Pretend you followed it with real money since the start. Then compare it to the laziest move on earth. Buy once. Never touch it.

If the clever timing lost to doing nothing, the timing was worthless. A fancy diet only counts if it beats just eating normal portions.

TEST 5. WATCH THE WIGGLE WORDS

"Around." "Roughly." "Within a few years."

The wider the window, the easier the win. Give a broken clock a wide enough window and it looks right twice a day.

A real call names a tight date. A fake one hides in wiggle room.

And watch for fake skill.

Sometimes a prediction feels safe for a reason that has nothing to do with whether it works.

Maybe it just kept you sitting in cash a lot, and sitting in cash makes any ride feel calmer.

Always ask what is really causing the good-looking number.

WATCH ME BREAK ONE CHART

The Benner 2026 chart. All 5 tests.

This is the 1875 farmer chart everyone is sharing. It says sell in 2026. Let us run the checks.

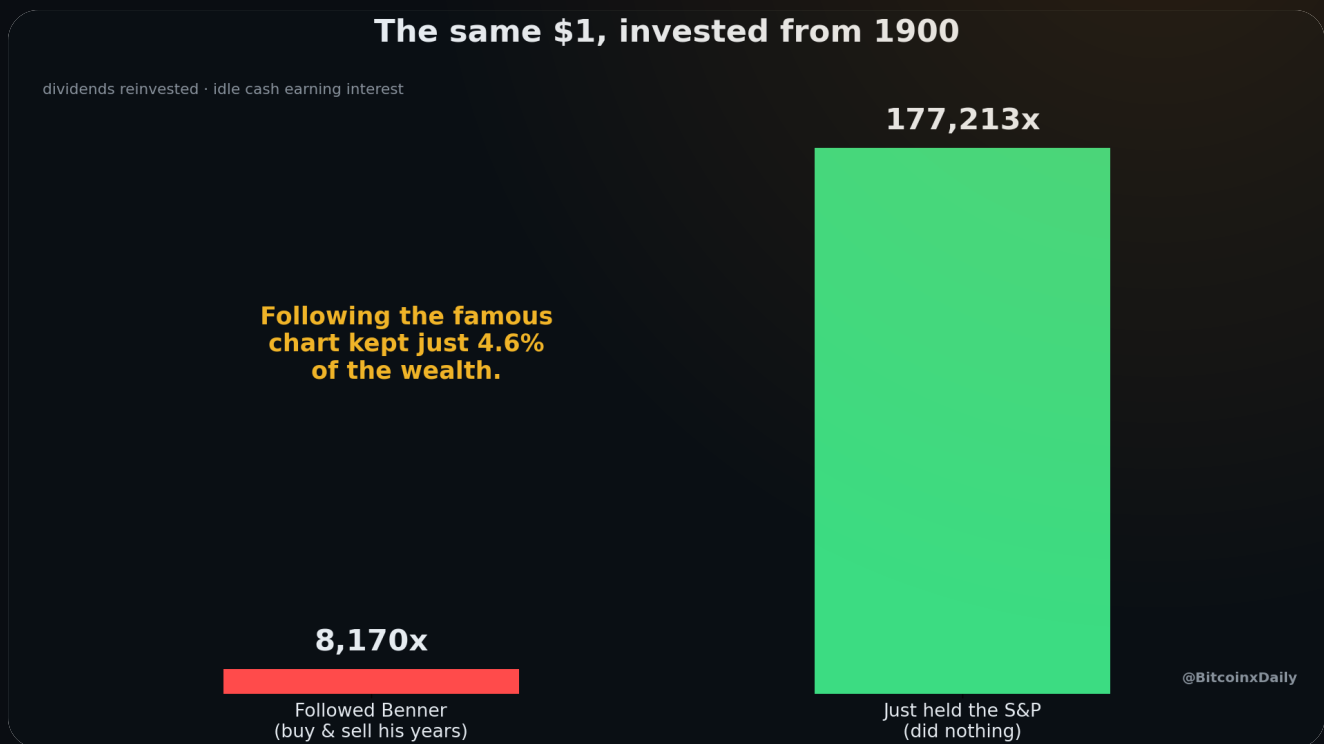


1. **Pin it down.** It names 2026 as a year to sell. It gave a date. **PASS**

2. **Count the misses.** It called the 2007 top to the exact year. But it missed the 1929 crash and the 2008 crash, the two everyone remembers. **FAIL**

3. **Beat the coin.** Its best row is right about half the time. A random guess lands near a real top about as often. **FAIL**

4. Beat doing nothing. If you had traded it since 1900, you would have kept under a nickel of every dollar that just holding made you. **FAIL**

5. Wiggle words and fake skill. It leans on "within a year." And its one good point, a calmer ride, only came from sitting in cash. **FAIL**

FINAL STAMP. DOES NOT SURVIVE.

The market does run on a clock. Just not this one.

NOW YOU TRY IT

Next time a chart, indicator, or prediction promises to call the market, run it through the same 5 boxes.

Test 1. Pin it down. Pass Fail

Test 2. Count the misses. Pass Fail

Test 3. Beat the coin. Pass Fail

Test 4. Beat doing nothing. Pass Fail

Test 5. Wiggle words and fake skill. Pass Fail

If it fails even one, you do not owe it your money.

One honest note. The instinct that the market has a rhythm is not crazy. Most clocks fail these 5 tests. A rare few survive. The cycle work that passes every one of them is what I share with members in the Discord.
